

STUDENT WORLD LANGUAGE COMPETITION 2021

ENL Video Category: Digital Storytelling - the art of telling stories with an audio/video presentation of the student's interpretation of one of the below topics. Graphics, photos, images are acceptable.

- Describe a cultural aspect of your life in your native country that you think Americans would like to know about. Explain the cultural aspect as it relates to your life experiences.
- Describe something or someone special in your life. Use words to describe the smells, sights, and sounds that will give the reader a clear picture.

Directions:

- Submitting teacher must be a current member of LILT
- All entries must be original student productions.
- The presentation should be no longer than **five minutes** in length including opening credits.
- No foreign words permitted. This includes all foreign brand names, names of stores, places, etc.
- Everything must be in English.
- If a photograph/image is taken from the Internet it must be cited properly if necessary.
- OPENING CREDITS should be embedded into the video file, are required for each video production and **MUST** be shown for at least **10 seconds**. It must contain the following information:
 - Title (topic) of the presentation
 - Name of school and teacher
 - Division/level of students (see below)
 - A list of the students who made the video (no more than 4)
- All students should speak slowly and enunciate clearly.
- Some teacher correction is allowed.
- No student may be included in more than one video production.
- All video submissions must be submitted as links to a YouTube video. Upload the video to YouTube (**as an Unlisted Video**) and complete the student entry form.
- Deadline to register and submit: **Monday, March 15, 2021**



Divisions for ENL submissions:

- A - Elementary
- B - Middle School/Junior High
- C - High School

*Each division will be divided into the following 3 levels:

- ❖ Entering
- ❖ Emerging and Transitioning
- ❖ Expanding and Commanding
